DESERT CREST CLUB HAPPENINGS

Welcome back to all of our Snowbirds and seasonal residents! We look forward to your returning and hope you enjoy all the changes and updates.

Many projects have been completed since last spring and I will summarize here for your information:

Pool/Spas

Our contractor for revitalizing the pool was able to work us in earlier than we had expected so all of our pool updating is done, including installation of a new handicap chair, benches for seating around the area repaired, and repainted with new cushions made for each (cushions compliments of Celeste Taylor and Jamie Flippin). There are new tables in the pool back patio area and on the upper patio deck by the clubhouse dining room. All 3 spas have also been revitalized and reopened for your enjoyment. The interior sections of the pool and patio areas have been repainted, flowers weeded, with more lighting, plants and decorations added.

Golf Course

The course has been readied for play as of October 21. We appreciate all the work our guys have done to get it ready for the season. At this time it does not have the fairways vou have become used to as we are down one mower which does that particular mowing. A new mower has been ordered and should be delivered by the first of November. When it arrives and is working the fairways will be back in place. I am looking for a couple of volunteers to help me with the course during season. If you might be interested give me a call. A meeting for golfers and residents will be held at the Clubhouse on November 30 at 6:30 PM to discuss needs of the course, golfers and residents. A tentative agenda will be sent out before the meeting.

Front Entrance

The East side of the front entrance is completed. It is a desert scene making it more environmentally friendly. We put additional lighting at the entrance and more lights on the trees as you enter the park. By the end of the year we will work on the West side and repairing the electrical on that side. A solar street light is being installed at the front entrance to allow more visibility for security purposes and to enable our security cameras to have better views during the evening and early morning hours.

Southeast Entrance to upper deck near Library

A new ramp has been installed with handrails to make it easier for some to walk up that incline. We have also installed more lighting in that area for security.

Parking Lot

We have begun patch work on the West side of the Clubhouse. If you see cones out please be careful in those areas. When we are finished with that side we will move to the East side.

We are looking into replacing the parking lot lighting which may include additional lighting. This is in progress.

Restaurant/Real Estate and Beauty Shop Building

The restaurant and real estate office is open. A new addition is the Desert Crest Salon. Owner/ Hairstylist is Lily and you can reach her at 760-671-6825. This shop has been renovated and is ready for customers.

Shuffleboard Building

The carpeting in the building has been removed, swamp coolers, and leaks in the coolers and the roof have been repaired. All the drains have been blown out and all "objects" removed. With the two rains we had in the last 2 weeks we had no leaks and no damage! New carpeting has been purchased by the Recycling Committee and our staff has installed it along with patching and repairing other places in the building. It is ready for a great season of shuffleboard!

Membership Badges

Please wear your membership badge anytime you are using a Club facility, attending an event at the Club (unless otherwise noted), golfing, shuffle boarding, swimming, anytime you are on Club property. Staff members have been instructed to do badge checks randomly. If they ask you for your badge please show it to them without hesitation. This is for your personal safety and that of the entire community, including staff. Please cooperate respectfully with this request. If wearing of badges continues to be a problem, we may need to address restricting privileges so that everyone is in compliance.

In November we will be recalling all renters badges. New badges will be awarded to owners and renters in good standing. If an owner is not in good standing, a renter is not in good standing. Owners, please let you tenants know this will be happening so you can be sure you are able to justify all your badge requests. Return those already in your possession. <u>This is for renters</u> <u>only at this time</u>. If a badge is not turned in, a new one will not be given.

Owners: if you have a home that is a rental and it is vacant, no badges will be issued until such time as a renter is living in the property, the owner is in good standing, and the renter has been interviewed by the Association/Club.


